



Dynamics of Communion

Matthew 26:26-28

26 Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body."

27 And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you,

28 for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.

The Lord's Supper

Unleavened bread and fruit of the vine were part of the meal.

Jesus indicated that the bread was symbolic of his body, an unblemished sacrifice for our sins, and the fruit of the vine symbolic of his blood shed for us.

Partaking in the communion gives the believer an opportunity to obey the command of Christ to remember as:

- Our almighty Savior.
- Our Good Shepherd.
- Dying in our place.
- Our coming King.
